Qualifications

- *All students are given the Gates MacGinitie Reading Test (GMRT) in December of 5th grade. Students who score in the 35th percentile and below qualify for strategic reading. Students who score between the 36th and 50th percentile on the GMRT are considered on an individual basis.
- *Additional criteria that is considered:
 - *teacher recommendation
 - *progress monitoring data through Aimsweb

What I know about my students

- Struggling readers often fake their way through text by listening to class discussions, relying on others students who actually read & understand or by accessing SparkNotes type websites. This is how they survive.
- Reading strategies cannot be taught in isolation. Students need time to practice and apply them. They need to read!
